

**KAMERION WIMBLEY**

#### **OVERVIEW**

Thanks largely to the success that the Indianapolis Colts have had with Dwight Freeney and Robert Mathis, the age of the undersized, yet cat-quick edge rushers has become vogue in the National Football League. Many pro personnel decision makers have been keeping close tabs on Wimberly, a player who certainly fits the mold of the "new age" pass rushers.

Wimberly competed as a defensive end, linebacker, quarterback, receiver and punter at Northwest High School. He earned Parade magazine All-American honors during his senior season and was considered to be one of the top high school athletes in the nation. He also earned Super Prep All-American accolades and was the fifth-rated prospect in the state of Kansas by that recruiting service. He was the fourth-rated defensive end in the nation by Rivals100.com and named to the Prep Star Dream Team.

Kamerion graduated from Northwest High in December of 2001 (a semester early) and enrolled at Florida State in the spring of 2002. He selected FSU over Notre Dame, Nebraska, Oklahoma and Tennessee. He appeared in thirteen games as a true freshman, seeing action mostly on special teams. He finished his first season with 17 tackles (13 solos) and a pair of fumble recoveries.

As a sophomore, he earned one starting assignment at right defensive end. He posted 38 tackles (30 solos) with 2.5 sacks, seven stops for losses and seven quarterback pressures. He caused and recovered a fumble and also deflected a pass. In 2004, he started twice at right end for an injured Eric Moore. He totaled 27 tackles (13 solos) with two sacks, 5.5 stops behind the line of scrimmage and seven pressures.

With Moore having graduated, Wimberly took over right end duties full-time in 2005. He started nine times, posting 26 tackles (11 solos) with a career-high seven sacks and eleven stops for losses. He generated 17 pressures and also deflected four passes.

In 49 games with the Seminoles, Kamerion started twelve times. He finished his career with 108 tackles (67 solos), twelve sacks for minus 85 yards and 23.5 stops for losses of 123 yards. He registered 31 quarterback pressures with three fumble recoveries, a forced fumble and eight pass deflections.

#### **CAREER NOTES**

Ranks sixteenth in school history with 23.5 stops for losses of 123 yards...His eleven tackles behind the line of scrimmage in 2005 rank tied for 19<sup>th</sup> on the school's season-record list...Had a string of 48 consecutive games played snapped when he suffered a knee injury vs. North Carolina State in 2005.

#### **2005 SEASON**

All-Atlantic Coast Conference second-team selection...Started the first nine games of the season at right defensive end...A left knee sprain vs. North Carolina State would sideline him vs. Clemson, Florida and Virginia Tech...Made 26 tackles (11 solos) with 7.5 sacks for minus 56 yards, eleven stops for losses of 68 yards and 17 quarterback pressures...Also deflected four passes...23 of his hits came in run support...Earned the Hinesman Award from the coaching staff as the most dominating player during spring practice in 2005.

#### **2004 SEASON**

Played in every game, starting at right defensive end vs. Syracuse and Virginia for an injured Eric Moore...Finished with 27 tackles (13 solos), two sacks for minus 13 yards, 5.5 stops for losses of 22 yards and seven pressures...Also deflected a pass...Part of a defensive unit that allowed only 83.1 yards per game and 2.4 yards per carry on the ground during the season...The Seminoles' defense also allowed a conference-low five rushing touchdowns.

#### **2003 SEASON**

Played in every game, starting the Duke contest at right defensive end...Recorded a career-high 38 tackles (30 solos) with 2.5 sacks for minus 16 yards and seven stops for losses of 33 yards...Credited with seven pressures and two pass deflections...Caused and recovered a fumble.

#### **2002 SEASON**

One of eight true freshmen to letter, playing in every game as a reserve defensive end...Recorded 17 tackles (13 solos) with two fumble recoveries and a pass deflection...Had a season-high six solo tackles vs. Georgia Tech.

#### **CAMPUS AGILITY TESTS**

4.67 in the 40-yard dash...346-pound bench press...508-pound squat...393-pound power clean...38-inch vertical jump...10'5" broad jump...34 ¼-inch arm length...10 ½-inch hands...Left-handed.

**HIGH SCHOOL**

Attended Northwest (Wichita, Kan.) High School, playing football for head coach Jim Moore...Competed as a defensive end, linebacker, quarterback, receiver and punter... Earned Parade magazine All-American honors during his senior season and was considered to be one of the top high school athletes in the nation...Also earned Super Prep All-American accolades and was the fifth-rated prospect in the state of Kansas by that recruiting service...Was the fourth-rated defensive end in the nation by Rivals100.com and named to the Prep Star Dream Team.
